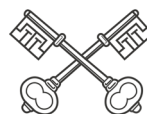

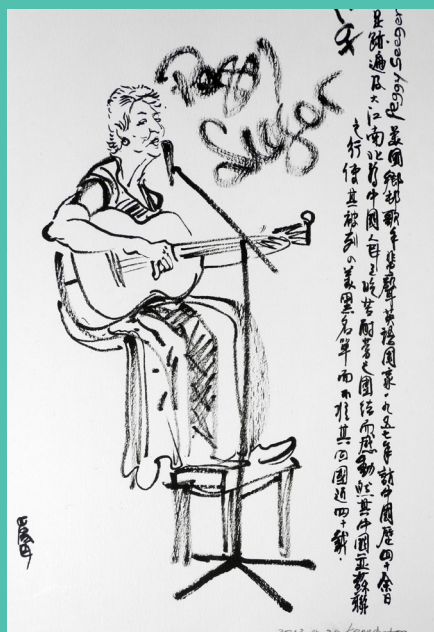

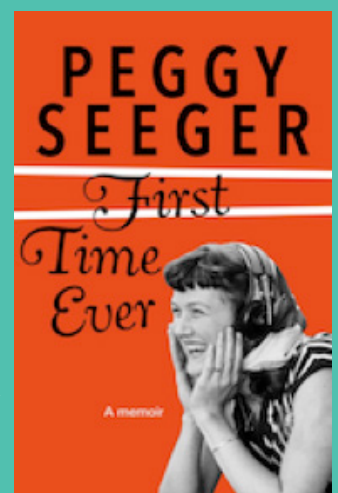
Friday 20 April

8-9 pm Peggy will talk about her life and illustrate it with music!

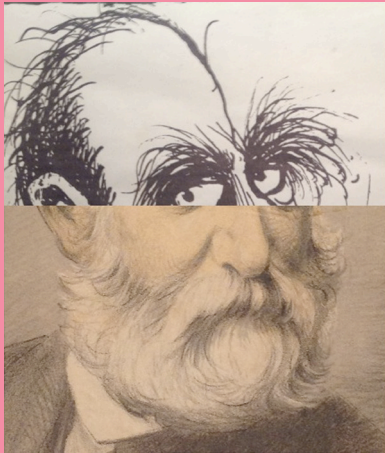
Peggy Seeger is folk royalty but her musical connections are wide. Her mother Ruth Crawford was the first female modernist classical composer in the USA. Her father Charles with Alan Lomax recorded the history and variety of music traditions in the USA. Her brother Pete the

celebrated writer of protest songs sang at President Obama's inauguration. With her British husband Ewan MacColl she revived the English folk scene with the BBC Radio Ballads. Ewan wrote 'First Time Ever I Saw your Face' for her. Her life has been lived at the heart of major world events making her memoir truly memorable.

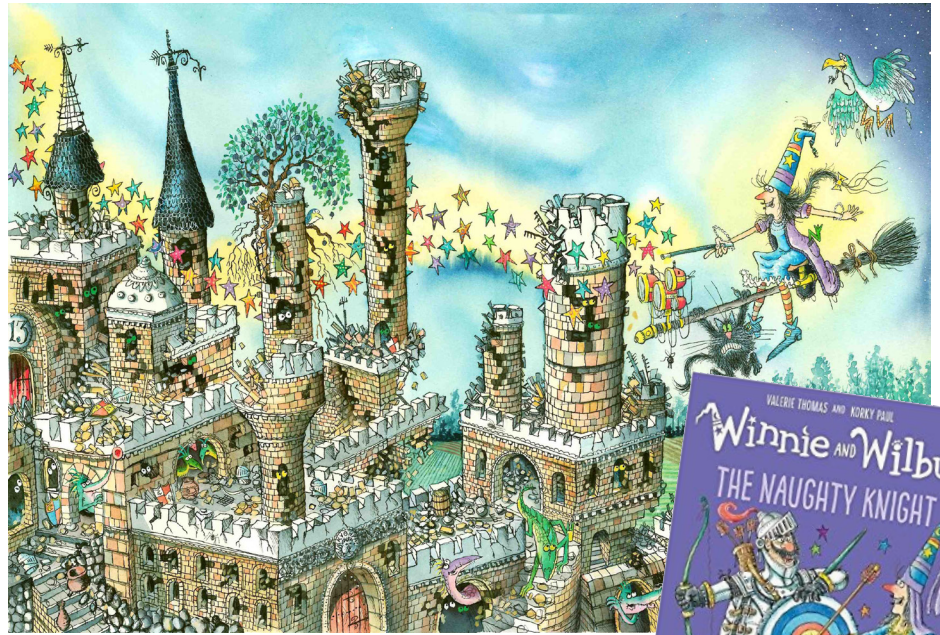


Peggy Seeger will be interviewed by James Harrison of Oxfordfolio who is also a regular contributor on Radio Oxford.

10.15–11.15 Family event with **Korky Paul**, the famous children's book illustrator. Winnie the Witch at 30 – a comic genius!

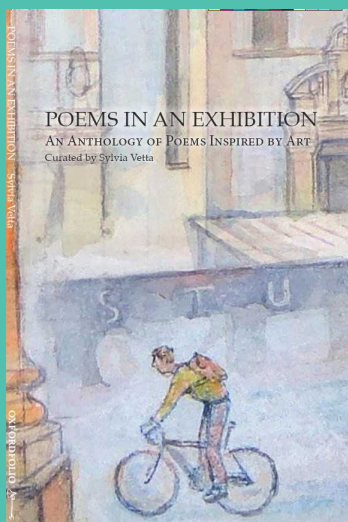

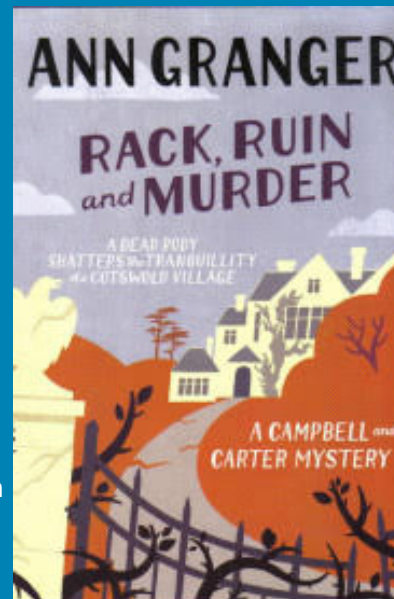

Ann's many best-selling crime novels have titles like *A Rare Interest in Corpses* and *A Mortal Curiosity*. Ann's curiosity has led her to set novels in C19th Newgate Prison - *The Testimony of the Hanged Man* - to contemporary aspiring actress, Fran Varady *Running Scared* when helping out her friend Ganesh in his shop.



Ann's books are among the most popular borrowed from Kennington Library. Ann's own life has taken her from Portsmouth to teaching in France, to working at British Embassies in Zambia and Germany before settling into a life of crime!

Anyone is welcome to an informal gathering for drinks at approx. **4.15** after the festival closes.



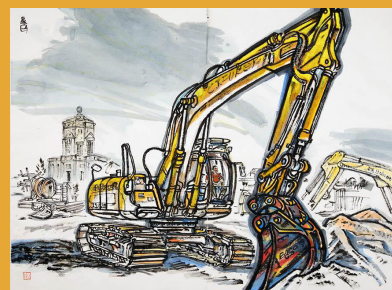

Chinese Calligraphy : Weimin will show you how and then you can have a go yourself!

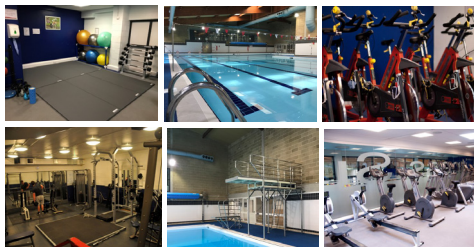
Dr Weimin He was born in Heilongjiang, Northeast China and came to Oxford as the Christensen Fellow of Chinese Painting at the Ashmolean Museum. His *Building of the New Ashmolean* was the first exhibition in the rebuilt museum. Following 6 years as part time artist-in-residence at the Oxford University Estates Services, in 2017, he had an exhibition in the Weston Library. A body of his work reflects the transformation of the *University of Oxford*.

Tower of the Winds is about to be published. He is a member of The Royal Society of Printmakers, teaches life drawing at Ruskin School of Art and Chinese calligraphy (to the general public) at Oxford Brookes University. 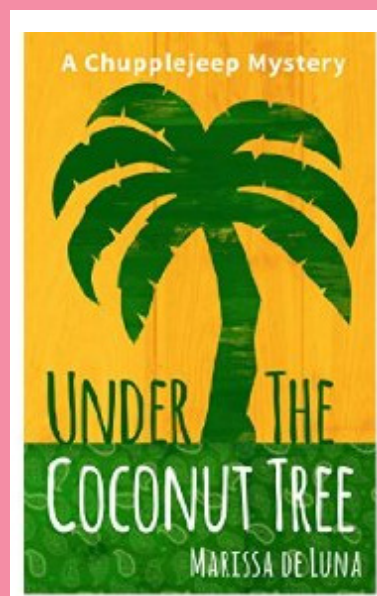

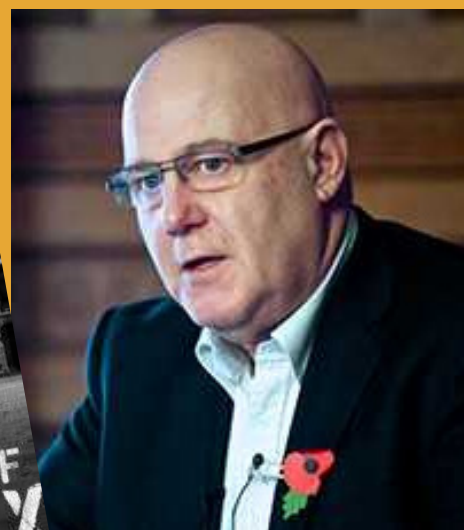
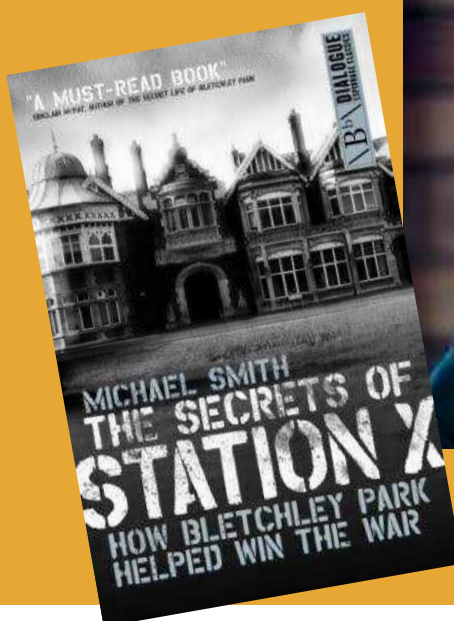


10.15–11am Kennington resident, **Marissa de Luna:** Novelist

Michael Smith is an author and journalist specialising in defence and Mi6. His best-selling books include *Secrets of Station X : How Bletchley Park Codebreakers Helped Win the War*.

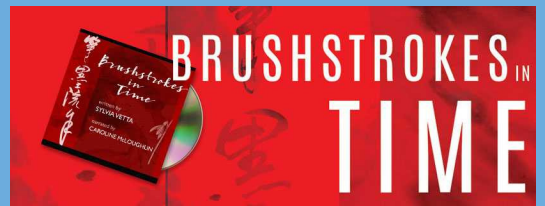
Other books by Smith include *Killer Elite: The inside Story of America's Most Secret Special Operations Team* (2006), which was updated in May 2011 to include the first accurate account of the killing of Osama bin Laden. His book *Foley: The Spy Who Saved 10,000 Jews* led to the recognition of the spy at Yad Vashem.



Saturday 21st Meeting Room Talks



Sylvia Vetta is an author and writer on art, antiques and history. Sylvia's first novel *Brushstrokes in Time* is mostly set in China. It was inspired by interviewing in depth the Stars Art Movement founder whose latest exhibition *Qu Leilei: A Chinese artist in Britain* is at the Ashmolean until April 15. Fictional heroine Little Winter is, like Leilei (and Weimin He) a passionate artist from the time she can hold a pen. Like everyone from an educated background her life is tossed into turmoil with the launch of the Cultural Revolution.
